I am obliged to the University Grants Commission for granting me some financial aid during a part of the research work, without which this thesis would not have been completed.

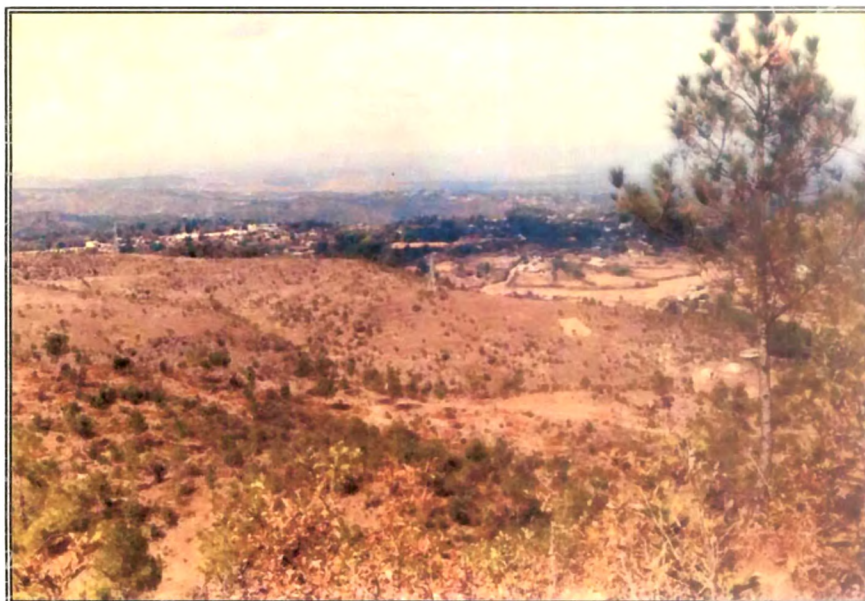
I thank Sri B. Sarma for helping me prepare the cartographic presentations. I am also grateful to Sri P. De for helping me with his deft camera-work.
